Metro Stop: Federal Triangle or Metro Center



Requests for a public tour of the White House must be submitted through one's Representative or Senator **at least 6 weeks prior** to your requested tour date. However, it is often best to submit your tour request **5 or 6 months in advance**. **Congressman Scott's Office will only submit requests for public tours of the White House on behalf of residents of the 3rd Congressional District of Virginia.**

To determine your representative in the House of Representatives, please visit www.house.gov and search for your representative using your nine digit zip code.

These self-guided tours of the East Wing are reserved on a first-come, first-serve basis and cannot be guaranteed. **Tours are available Tuesday through Thursday (7:30 am to 11:00 am); Friday (7:30 am to 12:00 pm); and Saturday (7:30 am to 1:00 pm).**

Visitors will be assigned a time by the White House and cannot select a preference. The White House will notify congressional offices if the tour is confirmed or unavailable about 2-3 weeks before the requested tour date.

If a tour has been confirmed, visitors **18 years of age or older** will be required to **present photo identification**

exactly matching the name submitted for clearance. Individuals whose identification does not exactly match the name cleared for entry may be denied admittance. Approved tours are also subject to last minute cancellations due to special events, emergencies, etc.

Security Information Requirements

The White House requires congressional offices to submit security information from constituents along with their tour requests. The required security information includes: Full Name, Date of Birth, whether they are a U.S. citizen, Country of Citizenship (for non-Citizens), Gender, City and State of Current Residence and Social Security Number (for any visitor who is 16 or older).

Please be prepared to provide this information when a member of Congressman Scott's staff contacts you to follow up on your request.
